Photo Critiques

has won several awards from the Photographic Society of America, FOTOCLAVE, and the Central Coast Counties Camera Club Council. To her, photography is great fun, and this came through with her comments on the twenty photos that were submitted for critique. She was delightful, as well as informative.

Some of the points Claudia emphasized:


- Darker around the edges will keep the eye in the photo.
- The eye will enter the photo left to right, so keep the left side of the composition "open". (For example, if you have a dark tree on the left side of your photo, try flipping it so the tree is on the right.)
- Heavier on the bottom and lighter on top will help "ground" the photo.
- Objects should not "kiss the edge" of the frame.
- Diagonal elements add drama to a composition, but they should not come right out of a corner.
- The most dramatic color schemes are blue & orange, red & green, and purple & yellow.
- Generally, an odd number of objects in a photo makes a more interesting composition than an even number.
