














Pre-Meeting One-on-One Assist with Yahoo & Flickr





The Yahoo Forum and the club's six Flickr sites are important means of communication for club members. They provide a platform to share ideas, resources, and photographs.

George Ziegler and **Michael Sue BrownKorbel** helped interested members set up their Yahoo & Flickr accounts, while **Barbi Kutilek** explained how to upload photos and send them to a group page.

Cameras...

With this program, the experts were the many members who willingly shared their knowledge and experience with their particular cameras, and demonstrated their favorite accessory. Everyone chose one of four subgroups based on the camera they wanted most to learn more about. Each subgoup had a facilitator (or two), but the main value came from the exchange of tips and tricks and information among the participants. The sub groups were:

Canon - Barbi Kutilek & Nichole Larson



The Canon subgroup was the largest and even though many different models were represented, there was enough comonality for everyone to learn something new. Several people

indicated they saw their "next" camera.

Point & Shoot Cameras Michael Sue BrownKorbel & Dan Gregg



Almost every photographer has a P&S camera. For some it is a secondary camera that is, "always with me," and for others, it is their main camera.

P&S cameras have come a long way with more pixels and advanced features, like in-camera HDR and panorama stitching, and built-in GPS, image stabilizion, and wi-fi.

Nikon - George Ziegler



Nikon was well represented. Members compared features on different models, debated sensor cleaning (DIY or have it professionally cleaned), and discussed how to use rear sync flash. One of the tips shared was to seal your camera in a plastic bag when heading inside from a very cold outside so condensation does not form inside the camera.



Other - Roy Hovey

Nikon and Canon may be the giants of the camera industry, but there are many other companies that manufacture great cameras. Last year only three people chose this group. This year fifteen people brought cameras manufactured by Panasonic, Olympus, Sony and Pentax.

According to Roy, "They have gotten way good and are hot on the Nikon/Canon trail." Some members had DSLRs, but most in this group used an Interchangeable Lens Compact (ILC) of one kind or another. Roy continued to state, "You can expect this group to grow in the future,

'cuz for all but professionals, these cameras are the future." Because some of these lighter, compact cameras have C size senors, several people in the group no longer carry a DSLR.

One member who works for a Silicon Valley company said that, among other things, it is developing a new Quad sensor for cameras that is so fast it will take ONE shot and "bracket" the data as it's gathered and turn out a subsequesnt HDR, light-balanced photo. An early version already appears on the high-end Panasonic G5 camera that one attendee owned, and we can expect to see this become common on many cameras very soon.

"Show & Share (cont.) ...and Accessories

How does a photographer keep up with all the new gadgets that fllood the market? One way is to see what other photographers have found essential.

Barbi Kutilek showed off a canvas shelf that attaches to a tripod and folds up within the legs. How handy is that!



Need to carry two cameras while George Ziegler shared a batvou run down the sidelines? Mike Malan demonstrated a system of straps that with just a simple twist, lock and/or release a camera (or two)



tery charger that (with adapters) fits a variety of batteries that need recharging. He never has to carry multiple chargers again.



Dump the Cables & Go Wireless With a **CamRanger, Dave Kutilek** wirelessly tethered his Canon DSLR (works with Nikon also) to his iPad








Susan Brazelton (this writer) wanted to meet some local photographers, so she put a few flyers up around town, talked to a few well-known local photographers, and asked **Cinda Meister** if the first meeting could be held at BookSmart. She thought maybe five people might show up. With twenty-one people attending that first meeting in April 2008, it was obvious that a larger meeting room would be necessary. Thanks to the enthusiastic support of **Susan Fent**, director of the Senior Center, the multi-purpose room at the Centennial Recreational Center was secured, and the meetings have been held there ever since. Thirty-four people came to the second meeting, an executive board was established, and the club was off and running. The people who attended the first meeting decided against holding competitions, and instead focused on "Fun, Friendship & Photography," which became our club motto. We started the monthly Flickr Theme Projects, published the newsletter, established a checking account, promoted the club at a downtown street fair, held our first gallery show, and created the Yahoo Discussion Forum. 2008 ended with eighty-five members. And then you could say, "The rest is history!"

Over the next four years the club

- Celebrated its one hundreth member (**Diane Rocha** in 2009)
- Selected the club logo
- Created a website (first by Roy Hovey and then by George Ziegler)
- Increased the number of gallery shows to three (and now four)
- Presented fifty-four monthly Programs
- Added two rotating Member-At-Large positions to the board
- Established Focus Groups
- Held more than 80 shoot-outs
- Generated over 7,700 postings on Flickr
- Doubled the club membership to 171 (by the end of 2012)
