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# **New Member Orientation**

## Image Share

What's as much fun as taking a photograph? Sharing it, of course. That's why our thirty-five minutes of round-robin image sharing is so popular. Several camera clubs to the north of us are thinking of adding image share to their monthly meetings.



## **Light Painting**

**Barbi Kutilek** and **Noella Vigeant** collaborated to create a unique, hands-on program to show members and guests how to paint photographs with light.

Light Painting is a creative photographic technique where images are made by moving hand-held light sources, either to create a unique pattern of light or to highlight an object; or by moving the camera during a long-exposure. A variety of light sources can be used, ranging from flashlights (with colored gels to get different effects), laser pointers, candles, matches, glowsticks, and MORE.... Barbi has a bag full of fun light toys.



- Noella first explained how to set up a camera so it is ready to photograph a pumpkin in the dark. 1. Set the camera mode to Shutter Priority (light painting needs a long exposure)
- 2. Set a shutter speed of 8 to 30 seconds (or use the 'bulb' setting for longer exposures).
- 3. Secure the camera to a tripod.
- 4. With a light shining on the main object (in this case, a pumpkin), allow the camera to autofocus.
- 5. Without changing anything else, switch to manual focus.
- 6. Turn off the lights, click the shutter and start painting with light.



- 1. Members may submit up to two prints of their own creation.
- 2. If submitting two images, each must represent a different category:
- •**PEOPLE** •**LANDSCAPE** •**URBAN** •**BLACK & WHITE** •**PLANTS & ANIMALS** 3. Each photograph <u>MUST HAVE A TITLE</u>.
- 4. Minimum size: 8x10 Maximum size: 20x20 (including mat or mount).
- 5. Attach a label to the back of each print with your name and the title of the photograph.
- 6. Prints must be matted or mounted on mat or foam board.

## Unmounted photos will NOT be accepted.

Prints in frames or behind glass will NOT be accepted.

A maximum of forty (40) prints will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. A table will be set up in the hallway outside the meeting room.


