The Shot by Mark Grzan


It was mid-morning on Friday, November 09, 2013. I was back at Harvey Bear Ranch County Park at the eastern terminus of San Martin Road in San Martin. I was there shortly after the 8 AM opening and headed east and south on the Rancho San Ysidro Trail via the Willow Springs Trail. My purpose was twofold, 1) get exercise, and 2) get a picture. Since I was carrying twenty-five pounds of camera equipment up and down four hundred feet of elevation, getting exercise was never in doubt.

On this morning, there were great shots to be found everywhere. The light was terrific, the sun was warm and there were some stratus clouds in the sky. The hillsides were a-blazing in rich cin-

namon and gold.

At 2.0 miles on the trail, there is a wonderful spring with a watering trough that seems to be a popular hot-spot for local furry and feathered residents. Looking up the trail I spotted a coyote. He was headed south, too far for me to get a picture. But then out of the corner of my eye, I saw movement in a gully to my left. It was another coyote. I quickly took off my pack to grab my telephoto lens. I was in a panic for I knew the coyote would not stay long. I switched lens and adjusted a few settings, later to realize they were wrong.

The coyote was initially in the shadow (see the dark background in the photo). He stepped forward and I took the shot. The composition is offset, the focus is the eyes (always) and positioned in the intersect of the upper right quadrant. Light is from the right and low. The darken background enhanced the coyote and the golden grass in the forefront was just a big plus.



ISO 4000 was much too high for the shot. In haste I miss-selected a high number for a high shutter speed to capture movement. The f/22.0 was also too high, a residual setting from the wide angle lens. I could should have moved to f/8.0 and a lower ISO for less noise. The shot is good none the less, but is a tad grainy if you zoom. Lessons learned: be patient; know your camera, lenses and settings for the light conditions; check before shooting; and don't rely on the LCD screen. It is better to get one excellent shot as opposed to a morning of missed shots.

I processed the raw image in Adobe's Camera Raw, adding vibrancy & sharpening, adjusted for noise without adding blur, added a little vignetting and reduced some shadows. I cropped to enhance the composition. I used Nik's Viveza 2.0 add-on for more structure that brought out more detail. The final image measures 9.7' x 10.7" for 109 MB @ 300 dpi, bit depth 16, and saved as a PSD file/image.

Nikon D800E with Nikon 80-400 f/4.5-5.6 with a 1.4 TC. Hand held at 1/320, f/22.0, ISO 4000 @112 mm. 10 AM Harvey Bear County Park in San Martin, CA , 37° 5'34.62"N, 121°33'30.71"W
