Page 10 One year ago we changed "Print Share" to "Image Share," a name that better reflected the many means in which photographers presented their images. Last month, to better accommodate the number of people who attend the meetings, we changed the table configuration from eleven half-tables with six chairs each to eleven full, round tables with eight to ten chairs each. The length of each round was stretched to twelve minutes and the number of rounds was reduced to three (from four).



Fourth Annual Scavenger Hunt: "Shapes & Texture"

Noella Vigeant explained that the purpose of the scavenger hunt was to help photographers expand their creative vision by searching for unique photographic subjects. Once you train your eye to see shapes (such as squares, triangles and circles), you can add them to your compositions and create one-of-a-kind photographs. As you practice "looking" you will begin to see more and more possibilities at just about any location. Textures can elicit feelings,tell a story of age or add impact to a photo. With cameras ready and lists in hand, this ultimate shoot-out had fifty-five photographers scouring the grounds to find unique interpretations of each item on the list.

For example: if David Rosas submits an image of a Line (number 4 on the list), he would re-name the file "04_DavidRosas.jpg"

open so the fourteen photographers who drove up the hill could paint it (both inside and out) with light. That was after considerable time was spent photographing the setting sun.








Johnson Garden Center - Saturday 14 June

A. The best way to learn how to prepare your file for printing at Bay Photo or AdoramaPIX is directly from them. Bay Photo uses proprietary software called ROES. Bay Photo's Support website is http://www.bayphoto.com/support/ and contains video and online tutorials that provide "everything you need to know when working with Bay Photo." The same holds true for AdoramaPIX. Their Solutions Library can be found at http://forums.adoramapix.com/categories/999-solutionslibrary. Another way is to ask other club members use Bay Photo or AdoramaPIX how they prepare their files. You can pose your question on our club discussion board at https://groups.yahoo. com/neo/groups/MHphotoclub/ There is also an excellent paper in the Print Focus Group Resource Library files section (https://groups.yahoo.com/neo/groups/MHphotoclub/files/Print%20 Focus%20Group%20Resource%20Library/) explaining how to print a file at the CostCo in Gilroy.

Image Review by Gary Hart

Gary will review 8 to 10 landscape photographs just like he does in his workshops. (This is NOT the same as the image critique programs.)

Gary will spend considerable time with each image, open it in Photoshop and **<u>SHOW</u>** how it might be improved.

If you would like to have one or two of your landscape images reviewed by Gary, follow this submission process exactly.

Only landscape images will be accepted, with no animals or structures Submission of an image does not guarantee that it will be reviewed.

Image(s) must be in jpeg format and be at least 1920 pixels on the longer side so that they will appear their best when they are projected. <u>Undersized images will not be used</u>

It is okay to do minimal post-processing on the image - e.g. dust spot removal, color correction, exposure correction, etc. The image should be in its original aspect ratio, i.e. it should not be cropped into another format. Gary's philosophy is to "get it right in the camera" so the closer your submitted image is to what the camera captured the greater the learning experience club members will receive. In fact, it is okay to submit an unprocessed image just to see what Gary will do with it.

Name the image file as follows: Start with your name e.g. "ClubMember"; followed with an underscore "_"; then two digits representing the number of the image submitted (e.g. 01 or 02). The complete file name should look something like this: ClubMember_01.jpg
