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
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## February Meeting

## “The Photographer’s Trilogy Part II”

Hands-on Practice led by **Noella Vigeant**

At the January meeting **George Ziegler** presented an in-depth review on how Aperture, ISO and Shutter Speed (the “Trilogy”) work together to create a photograph that has accurate exposure and appropriate depth-of-field. As a follow-up to that, **Noella Vigeant**, and a cadre of members\* who volunteered to help, led a practice session that emphasized how to use a camera’s Exposure Compensation dial to make sure that white shows up as white, and black shows up as black.

If you allow the camera to select the exposure, it will automatically render the scene/subject as middle gray. This means white snow and a black dog will both end up looking gray. To make snow look white, the photographer must over-ride the camera’s meter by adding more light to the exposure. To make the dog look black, you must dial down the amount of light that hits the sensor.

Exposure Compensation is available in these three modes:  
Program (P), Aperture (A or Av), and Shutter Speed (S or Tv)



## Shoot-outs





## January/February Critique Assignment

Every two months, members are challenged with a photographic assignment. Those who choose to accept the assignment may post up to three of their photos to a designated Flickr site under the following conditions:

- The photos must be taken during the assignment period. (approximately 8 weeks)
- Each person posting a photo is expected to give and receive constructive feedback.

**For every photo you post,  
you must give feedback to at least one other posted photo.**

The purpose of the critique assignments is to help members improve their photography by taking new photos; trying new techniques; exploring different subjects; and giving and receiving effective feedback.

1 January - 28 February

Photos could include a still life, the abundance at a farmer’s market, winter row crops, or a meal served in a restaurant. The food/drink need not be limited to that which humans consume, but the theme must be clearly communicated by the photo without additional explanation. (For example, even though a mountain lion might hunt and eat a deer, a photograph of a deer alone would not clearly communicate, “Food.”)

The file name for each photo should start with the club member's name e.g. "ClubMember"; followed with an underscore "\_"; then two digits representing the number of the image submitted (e.g. 01, 02, 03, etc.) in the order in which you wish them shown.

The complete file name should look something like this:
