# Gallery Show Call For Entries for Santa Clara County Parks

#### Due Date is this Sunday, April 8th and so far we have received almost ZERO entries

The Morgan Hill Photography Club & the Morgan Hill Historical Society (MHHS) are pleased to announce an open call for entries for an upcoming gallery show to be held at the Morgan Hill House May 7th–June 18th, 2018.

The theme of the exhibition is Santa Clara County Parks. There are 28 parks in Santa Clara County: <u>https://www.sccgov.org/sites/parks/parkfinder/Pages/parkfinder.aspx</u> to see the list. If possible, the Gallery Show Team would like to have all 28 parks represented in this exhibit therefore when you submit your entries each entry needs to be from a different park. Your photographs may be reproduced in B/W, or color. All photos must represent the theme and must be suitable in subject matter for a diverse and general audience.

Click here to download the Exhibition Rules, and read them carefully, as some of the rules have changed.

Each MHPC member may submit up to three works for review by the selection committee. If submitting more than one image, the probability of selection will be increased if the images are of different parks. Photographs must be the original work of the photographer, have been captured by a digital or film photographic process, be framed or mounted, and have not been in a previous MHPC photographic exhibition. The minimum size of accepted photographs is 8" x 10" (exclusive of the mat and/or frame).

Due to space limitations in this venue the image, INCLUDING THE FRAME, cannot be larger than 24 inches on the longest side.

Submission Process: your entries must be submitted online by emailing a jpg copy of the image to: submissions@morganhillphotographyclub.org no later than 09:00PM, Sunday, April 8th, 2018. Resize your image to be 1920 pixels on the longest side. The Gallery Show Team will only accept entries submitted via email, are the correct size, and which are received before the deadline.

The Artists' Reception is scheduled for Friday, May 11th, 2018 from 6:00PM–8:00PM. The artists are expected to attend and provide appetizers for the guests viewing the exhibition.






















#### The Master Photographers: Joe Azevedo

March 2018 Interview with Joe Azevedo by Jeff DuBridge at Joes's Place

JD: When did you start to really take hold in the photography realm?



JA: I think I started taking my first photographs around '97–'98. I had my Dad's old Minolta 370's and then I bought another Minolta camera body, X70. I just started shooting. I would take the family with me after work or on the weekend and take pictures of the coast and of other landscapes.

I was taking to some people at work and they told me I should start shooting slides-more color to them. So I started shooting Kodachrome and Ektachrome and that was all, just slides. It was tough at times; underexpose, overexpose. With the slides, you did not obtain that instant feedback you get with digital. I did slides for about three to four years and then the family started growing up and I had to do more things around the house...and put the camera by the wayside for a while. I had these tons of slides that I had taken. I entered a few contests every once and awhile and received some honorable mentions in some magazines. You really get excited

when you see something printed. I just let it go for awhile. Six years ago we had our 25th wedding anniversary...

JD: Wait! Is this your second marriage or your third?

JA: This is our first.

JD: You're following the norm, you need to break up. The wife and I have been together since high school and I tell her, "We've been together since high school and I love you but we're not following the norm, we need to break up." (laughter)

JA: On our 25th wedding anniversary we had a party and my family got together and gave me the Canon Rebel T2 kit, the first digital, with lens, the whole set-up. We went on vacation to Lake Tahoe, I could see immediately what I shot and I simply started having some fun again. I started taking more trips to the NorthEast, see my cousin in Vancouver, WA, next to OR, all around that region, and of course I would always have my new camera with me. Before I knew it, landscapes were being shot more and more. In 2015 I started to back to photography quite strongly. In August 2015, I went back to Lassen and

took a variety of shots throughout the park and was amazed at the shots taken. From that point forward I've been shooting steadily.

JD: I understand Lassen still has volcanic activity.

JA: Yes, eruptions are still occurring and a few spots are accessible for hikers to view the sulfur, bubbling and the like.

JD: Sounds good. Jump in and get a good cleansing. (laughter)

JA: There is a story about a logger

March 2018 Interview with Joe Azevedo by Jeff DuBridge at Joes's Place

I have a few good photographs of trees, their shadows and the like in the early morning downtown Morgan Hill.

JA: When it comes to taking pictures of people, I am not very skilled in that area. If I was planning on photographing people in a studio environment, I currently am not set-up for such work. I don't have a lot of interest at this time in getting equipment to officially pho-



tograph studio work. That's the reason I haven't joined the MHPC People Group. I do enjoy shooting people in a landscape though.

JD: What can be done with the People Group is to simply show up at an event, bring your camera and quite easily become involved. We love to share. You use a Canon so you can borrow my equipment; attach the PocketWizard transceiver to your hot shoe flash connection and it automatically fires the strobes and that is it. The shooting lasts up to four hours and I would love to share and teach you a few tricks about people photography. I am yet the top expert in this area so maybe you can teach me a few things.

If money was not an issue, what would buy in the photography arena: cameras, lens, any additional anythings?

JA: I would like to try Hasselblad formats, larger sensor/film, 4x5 format, try other manufacturers' cameras.

JD: Where would you like to go, again, money, time, not an issue?

JA: New Zealand, Antartica... would love to try Antartica before the Arctic. There's so many places that I have yet to explore.

JD: Do you shot RAW or jpeg?

JA: I shoot RAW.

Photos are downloaded into Lightroom and the HDRs are tried in both Lightroom and Aurora HDR.

JD: What camera(s) are you using now?

JA: Canon 6D. A friend gave it to me a few years ago. He knew I was getting into photography again, he wasn't, so he gave it to me for free.

JD: Putting aside camera and lens, what's your favorite accessory?

JA: Tripod

JD: If you had to choose just one lens, what would it be?

JA: The 24-70. You can do a lot with that one.

JD: Do you have any lighting equipment?



JA: My



ter's boyfriend gave me a ring flash. I have yet to use it, still need to learn procedures, but I plan to use it for macro work.

JD: How did you learn photography?

JA: My Dad shot photography as a hobby. I recall seeing lots of pictures, mostly B/W. He took official photography classes at San Jose City College, had a darkroom, enlarger, he did it all the time. My oldest brother does studio photography. My nephew does really good street photography. That's how I really learned it, through all the influence.

JD: How do you feel about cropping an image.

JA: I don't crop too much but I think it's okay.

JD: Have you ever considered making money in the photography realm: little, lots, part-time, full-time ...?

JA: I have considered it but haven't planned to go full-time. Plans have yet to be laid out, procedures, marketing, the whole lot ... If I could supplement my income with photography or do it full-time, that would be great!

JD: Final question. What would be your dream photo assignment?

JA: To be recognized by a critical agency, National Geographic, or similar publisher. Also, given an assignment in an area due to my being recognized as one of the best.


The value always been an early riser, even as a kid. It gave me the time to watch cartoons before chores had to be done. I liked to watch the sun come up and look at the colors. The same still holds true today. When I am set to wake up and go out to a photo safari, I can't sleep very well. I wish for the night to go by fast, so I can be on my way. Sure, it's cold and dark, but I love it. I love the preparation. The putting on layers of clothing and making sure all the camera gear is in place one more time. I leave, quiet, not wanting to wake anyone up and hoping to be the first set of eyes on the horizon. It's dawn now and the fun for me has just begun.

My photos, my technique is not any different than anyone else's, but their mine. My time. My effort to seek an image that I like. I have learned a tremendous amount in the past three years and just getting to where I know I can be better. Thank goodness to YouTube, to helpful neighbors and fellow MHPC members that are generous with knowledge. It has pushed me and strengthened my skills. One technique that I like to use is HDR (High Dynamic Range). Its purpose is to give the photographer greater range of highlights and shadows by digitally combining images. I like to use the 5-image combination. I have my camera set-up to take as follows: -2, -1, 0, +1, +2. Some photographers take three, while others take seven, nine or even eleven. It is a personal choice with no right or wrong. When I use HDR, it is because the image in front of the lens is high in contrast or there are dramatic reflections of metal, or architecture. I will import them into Adobe Lightroom, select all five and combine them into an HDR image. Often, I will go into Photoshop and do additional editing, or I may use the HDR module in Photoshop. As you do more, you realize each module has a look to it and I often have more than one version of an HDR edited image. In addition, I may take the images and use Aurora HDR software to combine. Having choices is good and then, after all is done, I can review and discard the ones that don't hold up and narrow it down to one final image. Now, if you look up HDR images, one will find dramatic landscapes, super rich coloring and breathtaking technique or you may also find images that looks very "normal," not "over the top" and often time the difference may be the range of shadow and highlights you see. It's a viewer's choice to what is favored. HDR, like any other technique, will not correct a sub-par

composition nor will it fix the image con-


tent. The subject and how you present it is always the biggest challenge anyone producing photographic images faces.

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


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
